## Let's Go Shopping: January

Question 1: You and your sister want to combine your money and buy your mom a gift. You have $\$ 7.40$, and your sister has $\$ 10.04$. How much can you spend for your mom's gift?

Answer 1: This one's easy! $\$ 10.04$
7.40
$\$ 17.44$ is how much you can spend.

Question 2: You want to buy a toy for your younger brother. The price of the toy (including sales tax) is $\$ 12.58$. You have $\$ 10.09$ saved. How much more money do you need?

Answer 2: To figure this out, subtract the amount you have from the price of the toy. Here's how to do that:
\$12.58
$-10.09$
\$ 2.49 is how much you need.

Question 3: Derek bought a book for $\$ 16.85$. Janet bought a book for $\$ 10.25$. How much more expensive was Derek's book?

Answer 3: To figure this out, subtract the cost of Janet's book from the amount of Derek's book. Here's how to do that:
\$16.85

- 10.25
$\$ 6.60$ is how much more expensive Derek's book was.
